Toyota Blue Grass Stakes

Welcome to Keeneland's 2011 spring meeting, the official start of Keeneland's 75th anniversary celebration and a showcase of some of Thoroughbred racing's most prestigious events. Keeneland's richest and most famous race is the 87th running of the \$750,000 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1), an important stop on the road to the Kentucky Derby presented by Yum! Brands (G1) at Churchill Downs. Run on April 16, three weeks before the Kentucky Derby, the Toyota Blue Grass is a 1 1/8-mile test for 3-year-old Thoroughbreds with proven ability and those with emerging talents.

Named for the famous Bluegrass region of Central Kentucky, the Blue Grass first was held in 1911 at the old Kentucky Association track near downtown Lexington. The race quickly proved to be an important contest for 3-year-olds, as Blue Grass second-place finishers Meridian (1911), Donerail (1913) and Behave Yourself (1921) went on to win the Kentucky Derby. In 1926, the final year the race was held at the Kentucky Association track, Bubbling Over became the first horse to win the Blue Grass and the Kentucky Derby.

When the closure of the Kentucky Association track left Central Kentucky without a racetrack, a group of prominent area breeders went to work. In 1935, they founded the Keeneland Association, purchased 147 1/2 acres on Versailles Pike (now Road) from horseman J.O. "Jack" Keene and set out to create a model racetrack. Keeneland opened on October 15, 1936, for nine days of racing.

In April 1937, Keeneland held its inaugural spring meeting and ran the Blue Grass for the first time. On April 29, Maxwell Howard's Fencing defeated five rivals to win the \$5,000-added event. Since then, a total of nine winners of the Blue Grass have won the Kentucky Derby and another 10 horses who ran in the race have won the Run for the Roses. Among the Blue Grass-Kentucky Derby winners are some of the most famous Thoroughbreds in history, including Racing Hall of Fame members Northern Dancer, Riva Ridge and Spectacular Bid.

In the summer of 2006, Keeneland underwent a massive renovation that included reconfiguring the race-

track and installing the revolutionary Polytrack racing surface. Keeneland's new racetrack, which drew attention from inside and outside the Thoroughbred industry, debuted for the fall meeting of 2006.

The first Toyota Blue Grass to be run on Polytrack took place on April 14, 2007. The race produced one of the most exciting finishes of the entire year in Thoroughbred racing as less than a neck separated the first four horses at the wire. The winner was Silverton Hill LLC's Dominican, who nosed out champion and eventual Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense.



In 2008, trainer Todd Pletcher saddled the first two finishers of the Toyota Blue Grass when Monba, owned by Jack Wolf's Starlight Stable, Donald Lucarelli and Paul H. Saylor, defeated stablemate Cowboy Cal. The 2009 running was won by General Quarters – owned and trained by former high school principal Tom McCarthy, who was 75 at the time.

Last year, Tom and Jack Conway's Stately Victor, trained by Mike Maker, paid a stakes-record \$82.20 for a \$2 win ticket when he drew off to a 4 1/4-length victory before a record Toyota Blue Grass Day crowd of 33,727, the second-largest in Keeneland history. The son of Horse of the Year Ghostzapper is out of Collect the Cash, who won the 2000 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (G1) at Keeneland.

This year, the Toyota Blue Grass is among 16 stakes worth a total of \$3.425 million that Keeneland is holding during its 15-day spring meeting from April 8-29. For more information, visit Keeneland.com and ToyotaBlueGrassStakes.com.

Toyota's sponsorship of the Blue Grass Stakes

In 1957, the year Round Table won the Blue Grass Stakes at Keeneland, Toyota established a presence in the United States by setting up shop in a former Rambler dealership in Hollywood, California. Sales began in 1958 and totaled 288 vehicles: 287 Toyopet Crown sedans and one Land Cruiser.

Over the next several years, Toyota vehicles became so popular in this country that the Japanese automaker began to build manufacturing plants across the U.S.

In the 1980s, Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky (TMMK) built a plant in nearby Georgetown and in 1988 began producing the popular Camry. In 1996, Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky, five area Toyota dealerships and Toyota Motor Sales in Cincinnati teamed up to sponsor the Blue Grass Stakes, marking Toyota's first sponsorship of a horse race.

Toyota's \$4 billion, state-of-the-art automotive complex in Georgetown is Toyota's largest production facility outside of Japan. The Georgetown facility has the capacity to produce 500,000 vehicles and engines annually with nearly 7,000 employees. Its products include the

Camry, Camry Hybrid, Avalon and Venza. Meanwhile, Toyota relies on numerous suppliers from Kentucky and elsewhere in the United States.

Toyota hired team members from nearly every one of Kentucky's 120 counties and continues its philosophy of giving back to the communities where team members live. Since arriving in Georgetown in 1986, TMMK has distributed more than \$38 million in gifts and sponsorships across Kentucky.

Keeneland Sales fertile ground for Toyota Blue Grass winners

Keeneland the racetrack is most prominent in the eyes of the public, but Keeneland the sales company is really the engine that drives Keeneland. Sales revenues pay the costs of operating Keeneland's beautiful 1,038-acre facility with its 156 full-time and 1,275 part-time employees; enable Keeneland to make charitable contributions that benefit the Central Kentucky community and the Thoroughbred industry (since 1936, these contributions have exceeded \$18 million); and allow Keeneland to pursue innovative safety and welfare initiatives for people and racehorses and to fund equine research that benefits all breeds and disciplines.

Keeneland has sold 16 winners of the Kentucky Derby (G1), 18 Preakness Stakes (G1) winners and 16 Belmont Stakes (G1) winners. Keeneland has also sold five winners of the Epsom Derby (Eng-G1), helping make Keeneland the most international Thoroughbred sales company in the world. As a result, Keeneland has sold the 20 highest-priced yearlings in American history, led by the \$13.2-million record holder Seattle Dancer, all of them purchased by buyers based abroad.

The Toyota Blue Grass (G1) has been particularly fertile ground for graduates of Keeneland sales.

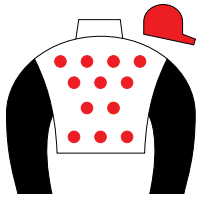

Charlotte C. Weber's Live Oak Plantation is one of Thoroughbred racing's most successful owners, and she has a great deal of involvement in the industry.

Weber is the granddaughter of Campbell Soup founder John T. Dorrance, and she serves as a board trustee of Campbell Soup Company. She also is a member of the board of trustees of the Metropolitan Museum of Art and provided funding for the Met Museum's Charlotte C. Weber Galleries for the Arts of Ancient China. Weber is a member of The Jockey Club, a board member of the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association and a trustee of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame. She was honored with the 2005 Penny Chenery Most Distinguished Woman in Racing Award.

Weber owns Live Oak Stud, a 4,500-acre Thoroughbred farm and commercial cattle operation located near Ocala, Florida. Live Oak has bred and raced a number of successful runners over the years. Among them are the half-brothers Sultry Song and Solar Splendor, who each captured a Grade 1 race on the same card in 1992 and retired as millionaires.

At Keeneland, Live Oak has raced four stakes winners. The first was In the Gold, who won the 2005 Stonerside Beaumont (G2), followed by Miesque's Approval, winner of the 2006 Maker's Mark Mile (G2); Revved Up, winner of the 2006 Sycamore Breeders' Cup (G3); and My Typhoon (IRE), winner of the 2007 Jenny Wiley (G3). Miesque's Approval also won the 2006 Net-Jets Breeders' Cup Mile (G1) and was named the year's champion grass male.

Trainer: Tom Albertrani

New York-based trainer Tom Albertrani was 13 when he went to work walking hots and grooming horses for his uncle, trainer Jack Abatemarco. He eventually became a jockey, winning 29 races over parts of six years. From there, Albertrani became an assistant to trainer Mark Casse and continued to gallop horses. He became an assistant to trainer Bill Mott in New York, and he later worked for other notable trainers.

In 1995, Godolphin Racing hired Albertrani, who became a top assistant with the main Godolphin string of trainer Saeed bin Suroor. While Albertrani worked with bin Suroor, Godolphin won 85 Grade 1 and Group 1 races. In 2003, Albertrani began training in New York full-time with 10 horses for Darley, all owned by members of the Maktoum royal family of Dubai. Two years later, with the permission of Darley, he opened a public stable for the first time to take on some outside clients.

Albertrani registered his first official stakes winner as a trainer of record in September 2004, with Swither in the \$250,000 NATC Sorority Futurity at Delaware Park for Darley. In 2006, Albertrani moved into the national spotlight with Darley's Bernardini, who won five consecutive stakes, including the Preakness (G1), Travers (G1) and Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1). Bernardini was second to eventual Horse of the Year Invador (ARG) in that year's Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and became the year's champion 3-year-old colt.

As of early April, Albertrani had won 271 races and had trained the earners of nearly \$18 million. His stakes horses also include Grade 1 winners Balletto (UAE) and Gozzip Girl.

Jockey: Joel Rosario

Southern California-based Joel Rosario, who in early April was the nation's leading rider by earnings and the leading jockey at Santa Anita Park, scored his first Keeneland stakes victory when he rode Harmonious to win last year's Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (G1). The victory came during the most lucrative season to date for Rosario, who rode the earners of nearly \$16 million. His mounts included eventual champion 3-year-

old filly Blind Luck, whom he rode to win the BetFair TVG Alabama (G1).

Rosario was born in the Dominican Republic and became a licensed professional jockey by the time he was 14. He began his riding career at Galapagos Hipodromo V Centenario in the Dominican and scored his first win there in July 2000. He went on to become the nation's leading rider.

Dominican bloodstock agent and former trainer Herbert Soto arranged for Rosario to come to the United

States in 2006, and Rosario first rode at Fairplex Park before heading north to Golden Gate Fields. He rode in Northern California for much of 2007, finishing second in the standings to perennial leader Russell Baze at both Golden Gate Fields and Bay Meadows. He won his first stakes in March 2007 at Bay Meadows.

As of early April, Rosario has ridden more than 1,000 winners and the earners of nearly \$45 million. This year, he has Grade 1 victories on Switch and Zazu.

IEAH Stables has been one of the most successful owners of Thoroughbreds in recent years. In 2008, IEAH and Paul Pompa Jr. raced Big Brown to win the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), the Preakness (G1) and Haskell Invitational (G1) en route to earning the Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old colt. In partnership with Greg James and Andrew Cohen, IEAH also raced Benny the Bull, who was named the 2008 champion sprinter.

Formed in 2003, IEAH stands for International Equine Acquisitions Holdings Inc. The company purchases and breeds Thoroughbreds and then organizes and manages partnerships for those horses. Michael Iavarone, a former Wall Street investment banker who formed IEAH, is the company's president and director. Richard J. Schiavo, who previously worked in the financial services industry, is secretary/director.

Clarke Lane is the first foal out of Wonder Lady Anne L, a Grade 1-winning daughter of Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Real Quiet who raced for IEAH. A \$190,000 purchase at the 2009 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, the Kentucky-bred colt began his career in England, where he had one win in four starts. He made his North American debut and his first start of 2011 on April 3, running second in a one-mile allowance race at Santa Anita. IEAH paid \$37,500 to supplement Clarke Lane to the Toyota Blue Grass.

At Keeneland, horses racing for IEAH include three-time stakes winner Kip Deville and Grade 1 winner Diamondrella (GB). IEAH and Pegasus won the 2008 Stonerside Beaumont (G2) with Ariege. The day before the Toyota Blue Grass, IEAH's Court Vision, another runner owned in partnership, will race in Keeneland's Maker's Mark Mile (G1). The millionaire's Grade 1 victories include the 2009 Shadwell Turf Mile (G1) at Keeneland. Court Vision was second in the Maker's Mark Mile last year.

After Clarke Lane opened his 2011 campaign with a runner-up finish in a one-mile allowance race at Santa Anita on April 3, his connections began to have thoughts of the Toyota Blue Grass (G1).

"He's a real tough horse, and he's not lost any weight from the race," Callaghan told Steve Andersen of *Daily Racing Form* about Clarke Lane. "It's something to look at. It's back quick, but it is that time of year with 3-year-old colts."

Clarke Lane is now scheduled to race in the Toyota Blue Grass after his connections paid \$37,500 to supplement the colt to the race.

Callaghan, who spent time working for Todd Pletcher, began his training career in England. In late 2009, he relocated to Southern California. One horse he brought with him from England was Turning Top (IRE), who won last year's Beverly Hills (G3) at Hollywood Park. Callaghan had not saddled a starter at Keeneland prior to 2011.

Team Valor International, a syndicate headed by Barry Irwin that is based in Versailles, Kentucky, forms partnerships to race Thoroughbreds at major venues in the United States and abroad. This year, Team Valor has a notable group of 3-year-olds, led by 2010 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G2) winner Pluck.

Joining Pluck are Animal Kingdom, a colt by Leroidesanimaux (BRZ) who won the Vinery Racing Spiral (G3) on March 26 at Turfway Park and is to make his next start in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), and Crimson China, a son of Giant's Causeway who was second in the Rushaway that same day and will race in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1). Team Valor also acquired Summer Soiree after the War Front filly won the Bourbonette Oaks (G3), also on March 26 at Turfway. She is to make her next start in the Kentucky Oaks (G1).

All of Team Valor's horses in North America are trained by H. Graham Motion and are based at the Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland. On his website, Irwin said he is a longtime advocate of European training methods, saying to have "one set of eyes on all his horses on a daily basis appealed to him and the chance to have Motion train the string was exhilarating."

Pluck and Animal Kingdom are Team Valor homebreds. Late last year, Team Valor purchased Crimson China after the colt had one win and one second in two starts over all-weather surfaces in England for trainer Brian Meehan. Crimson China made his first North American start in February, winning a 1 1/8-mile allowance race on turf at Gulfstream Park for Motion.

Irwin, a California native, is a former journalist who founded Clover Racing Stables with longtime friend Jeff Siegel in 1987. That venture became Team Valor in 1992 and raced such horses as Kentucky Derby runner-up Captain Bodgit. In 2007, Irwin bought out Siegel and renamed the stable Team Valor International, to reflect a change in the company's business plan that had taken effect in the years immediately preceding the buyout. With WinStar Farm and Sunmark Partners, Team Valor raced Ipi Tombe (ZIM) to win the 2003 Dubai Duty Free (UAE-G1) and be named Dubai Horse of the Year.

In her North American debut and her final career start, Ipi Tombe won the Locust Grove (G3) at Churchill Downs.

In November 2010, H. Graham Motion took over training all of Team Valor International's horses based in North America. A few days before, Motion earned his second victory in the Breeders' Cup Thoroughbred Championships when he sent out Shared Account to win the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1). The victory came six years after Motion saddled Better Talk Now to win the John Deere Breeders' Cup Turf (G1), the richest victory in the popular gelding's 51-race career in which he earned \$4,356,664.

This year, Motion also trains Team Valor's Animal Kingdom, a son of Leroidesanimaux (BRZ) who won the Vinery Racing Spiral (G3) on March 26 at Turfway Park. That same day, another Motion runner, Smart Bid, won the Mervin H. Muniz Jr. Memorial Handicap (G2) at Fair Grounds.

From England, Motion was raised in Newmarket at Herringwell Manor Stud operated by his parents. The family moved to the United States in 1980, and Motion completed high school and graduated from Kent in Connecticut. After working for Racing Hall of Fame trainer Jonathan Sheppard and then in France with trainer Jonathan Pease, Motion returned to the U.S. and became

an assistant to Bernie Bond in 1990. Following Bond's death, he took out his trainer's license.

Motion sent out his first starter at Keeneland in 1997. He has 69 wins here, including 13 stakes victories. In 2003, Motion earned his first Grade 1 victory when he sent out Film Maker to win the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup. The daughter of Dynaformer earned more than \$2.2 million in her career.

As of early April, Motion has trained nearly 1,500 winners and the earners of more than \$61 million in his career. He also has sent out Grade 1 winners Bullsbay, Check the Label and Gypsy's Warning (SAF). On April 9, Motion won the Resorts World New York Casino Wood Memorial (G1) with Toby's Corner.

Jockey: Alan Garcia

Last year, Alan Garcia scored two longshot victories in Grade 1 races at Keeneland. In April, he rode Stately Victor to a 40-1 upset in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1). In October, he rode Acoma to win the Juddmonte Spinster (G1) at odds of 23.80-1. Those victories marked Garcia's first two stakes wins at Keeneland.

From Lima, Peru, Garcia represents the third generation of his family to ride racehorses. Garcia graduated from the nation's jockey school, and he was Peru's leading apprentice in 2003. At the suggestion of friend

and fellow rider Alfredo Clemente, Garcia came to the United States that same year and was the leading apprentice at The Meadowlands after a brief tenure as an exercise rider in Kentucky. He has been based in New York since 2007.

In 2007, Garcia joined a select group of riders to win a race during the Breeders' Cup World Championships with his first mount in the event. That horse was Lahudood, (GB) who captured the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1). Kiaran McLaughlin trained Lahudood, who earned the Eclipse Award as the year's champion older turf female.

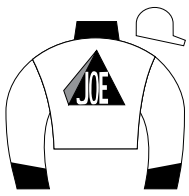
In 2008, Garcia rode Da' Tara to an upset victory in the Belmont Stakes (G1). That same year, he secured his first title as a leading jockey when he led the standings at Saratoga.

Since 2003, Garcia has ridden more than 1,100 winners and the earners of more than \$60 million as of early April. This year, his mounts have included Triple Crown hopeful Soldat and Crimson China's stablemate, Animal Kingdom, whom he rode to win the Vinery Racing Spiral (G3).

Joes Blazing Aaron is a homebred racing for Joseph Witek, a radiologist in South Florida who paid \$37,500 to supplement the gelding to the Toyota Blue Grass (G1). After beginning his career on dirt, the gelding was moved to turf and has won two consecutive races. The first was against \$50,000 claimers in February at Gulfstream, where he scored a 73-1 upset going 1 1/16 miles. The second was in March in his stakes debut in Gulfstream's Palm Beach (G3), which Joes Blazing Aaron won at odds of 11-1. Joes Blazing Aaron was saddled to those victories by Calder Race Course-based trainer Allan Hunter Jr.

After the Palm Beach, Joes Blazing Aaron was moved to trainer Mike Maker and sent to Maker's barn at the Trackside training center in Louisville. The Toyota Blue Grass also has attracted Palm Beach runner-up Queen'splatekitten and third-place finisher Newsdad.

A half-brother to multiple Group 2-placed Danse Grecque, Joes Blazing Aaron descends from a half-sister to two-time Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (FR-G1) winner and successful sire Alleged.

Last year, Mike Maker made history when he sent out 40-1 longshot Stately Victor to win the Toyota Blue Grass (G1). Racing for Tom and Jack Conway, the son of Ghostzapper won the race by 4 ¼ lengths and paid a whopping \$82.20 while giving Maker the first Keeneland stakes win of his career.

Maker, the leading trainer during Keeneland's 2008 fall meeting, is one of the many successful former assistants to Racing Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Maker, whose father trained Thoroughbreds in Michigan, began working for Lukas in 1993 and was involved with such notable Lukas horses as Kentucky Derby (G1) and Preakness (G1) winner Charismatic and Breeders' Cup winners Cat Thief, Orientate, Surfside and Spain.

Maker went out on his own in 2003 and is based at the Trackside Training Center near Churchill Downs. Among his accomplishments is winning a record 21 races during Churchill's 2008 fall season. In 2008, Maker also claimed Furthest Land for \$25,000 for owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey and in 2009 saddled the runner to win the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) for the first Grade 1 victory of his career.

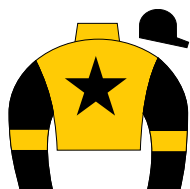

Terry Finley is the founder and president of West Point Thoroughbreds Inc., which offers partnerships in Thoroughbred ownership. According to the West Point website, the company currently manages equine portfolios for nearly 400 partners and a stable of more than 80 horses. It maintains offices in New Jersey, New York, Kentucky and California.

Finley, a graduate of West Point, is a former Army Captain and Airborne Ranger who holds an MSBA from Boston University. He has been involved in the Thoroughbred industry for more than 25 years, gaining hands-on experience working with Thoroughbreds as a teenager and starting racing partnerships in 1991.

Horses carrying the West Point silks have competed in the most prestigious events in Thoroughbred racing in the United States and in prominent international venues. West Point has won Grade 1 races with Awesome Gem, Dream Rush, Flashy Bull, Irish Smoke, Lear's Princess and Macho Again.

King Congie is named for West Point's late communications director, Congie DeVito, who owned a percentage of the colt. DeVito, who had Osteogenesis Imperfecta, commonly called brittle bone disease, died in February at age 35.

"We know how difficult it is to own race horses.," Finley told Frank Angst of *Thoroughbred Times*. "He (DeVito) is the one who taught us that it's about people and relationships. When people are comfortable and trust you, they put faith in you, and you get people to

come back. He was the one who set the example for all of us."

Trainer: Tom Albertrani

New York-based trainer Tom Albertrani was 13 when he went to work walking hots and grooming horses for his uncle, trainer Jack Abatemarco. He eventually became a jockey, winning 29 races over parts of six years. From there, Albertrani became an assistant to trainer Mark Casse and continued to gallop horses. He became an assistant to trainer Bill Mott in New York, and he later worked for other notable trainers.

In 1995, Godolphin Racing hired Albertrani, who became a top assistant with the main Godolphin string of trainer Saeed bin Suroor. While Albertrani worked with bin Suroor, Godolphin won 85 Grade 1 and Group 1 races. In 2003, Albertrani began training in New York full-time with 10 horses for Darley, all owned by members of the Maktoum royal family of Dubai. Two years later, with the permission of Darley, he opened a public stable for the first time to take on some outside clients.

Albertrani registered his first official stakes winner as a trainer of record in September 2004, with Swither in the \$250,000 NATC Sorority Futurity at Delaware Park for Darley. In 2006, Albertrani moved into the national spotlight with Darley's Bernardini, who won five consecutive stakes, including the Preakness (G1), Travers (G1) and Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1). Bernardini was second to eventual Horse of the Year Invasor (ARG) in that year's Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and became the year's champion 3-year-old colt.

As of early April, Albertrani had won 271 races and had trained the earners of nearly \$18 million. His stakes horses also include Grade 1 winners Balletto (UAE) and Gozzip Girl.

Rajiv Maragh learned about racing from his father, Collin, a jockey in his native Jamaica who later embarked on a training career in South Florida. After graduating from high school, Maragh began to work at farms in Florida and galloped horses for his father, who gave him his first opportunity to ride competitively in 2003. He scored his first win at Tampa Bay Downs in February 2004.

Maragh caught the eye of Racing Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr., who brought him to New York in 2004. Maragh first rode at Keeneland in 2008 and through 2010 has won 12 races, including six stakes, at the track prior to the start of the 2011 spring meeting. He scored Grade 1 wins aboard Little Belle in the

2008 Ashland, Diamondrella (GB) in the 2009 First Lady and Negligee in the 2009 Darley Alcibiades. Last year, Maragh rode Wasted Tears to win the Jenny Wiley (G2) during the spring meeting.

As of early April, Maragh had ridden nearly 1,200 winners and the earners of more than \$46 million in his career. He rode Triple Crown hopeful Mucho Macho Man to win the Risen Star (G2) at Fair Grounds in February. On opening day at Keeneland, Maragh won the Transylvania (G3) on Air Support.

Kentucky-based businessman James S. Karp has bred several generations of Newsdad's female family, beginning with the colt's second dam, Sandy's Storm. The daughter of Storm Cat began her career at Keeneland in 1991 and made six starts at the track during her career, running second in the 1991 Green River Stakes on turf.

Sandy's Storm scored a win at Keeneland as a broodmare when her son Field Cat, by Metfield, won the 2000 Transylvania (now a Grade 3 stakes).

Karp first had a few horses with trainer Bill Mott some 20 years ago.

Trainer: Bill Mott

Prior to the start of Keeneland's 2011 spring season, Racing Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott has won 247 races, including 34 stakes, at the track. Both figures put Mott second behind D. Wayne Lukas on the list of the track's most successful trainers in both categories.

At Keeneland, Mott has been the leading trainer six times (spring of 1995, 2001 and 2009; fall of 1981, 1986 and 2007). He set a record for winners on a single card at Keeneland with four victories on April 9, 1995. He also has been the leading trainer at Belmont Park, Churchill Downs, Gulfstream Park and Saratoga Race Course. He is Churchill's all-time leading trainer by wins and stakes wins.

From South Dakota, Mott was 15 when he owned and trained his first racehorse. He later worked for Hall of Fame trainer Jack Van Berg for three years and started his own stable in the fall of 1978. In 1998, Mott was inducted into the Hall of Fame at the age of 45, becoming the youngest trainer to receive the honor.

Mott's many accomplishments include training Horse of the Year Cigar, who won the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and the inaugural running of the rich Dubai World Cup (G1) en route to earning \$9,999,815. Other champions he developed were Theatrical (IRE), Paradise Creek, Ajina and Escena. Last year, he scored his first classic victory when Drosselmeyer won the Belmont (G1), and he sent out Unrivaled Belle to win the Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic (G1).

As of early April, Mott has won more than 4,000 races and has saddled the earners of more than \$192 million.

Starlight returned to win the Toyota Blue Grass with Monba in 2008.

A native of Louisville, Jack Wolf earned a master's degree in economics from Murray State University in Kentucky and went on to teach and become a hedge fund manager with Columbus Partners in Atlanta before retiring to concentrate on racing. Laurie Wolf graduated from McNeese State University in Louisiana with a degree in communications and theater. The Wolfs reside in Louisville and Saratoga Springs, New York.

Harlan's Holiday and Monba are on an impressive list of horses campaigned by Starlight. In partnership with Johns Martin and Paul Saylor, Starlight raced multiple champion Ashado, who won seven Grade 1 races and earned more than \$3.9 million. In 2005, the partners sold Ashado at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale for \$9 million—then a sale record for a broodmare or broodmare prospect. John Ferguson purchased Ashado on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum.

Starlight also raced Grade 1 winners Octave and Take the Points. Starlight, Martin and Saylor also campaigned Grade 1 winner Purge.

Lucarelli and his wife, Barbara, live in Duanesberg,

New York. The Lucarellis spent part of every summer for three decades at Saratoga Race Course, envisioning the day when they might have their own racehorses. When Donald Lucarelli's family business, Bellevue Builders Supply, was sold in 2004, the couple decided to invest in some runners. They turned to the Wolfs, whom they had met at a party the year before, and immediately scored with Grade 2 winner Keyed Entry. Saylor also was a partner in the ownership of Keyed Entry.

In the summer of 2007, the Wolfs and the Lucarellis formed a new entity, Starlight Racing, with the goal of investing in higher quality yearlings by joining a select few new partners who also want to compete at the top levels of the sport. Frank Brothers serves as Starlight's bloodstock agent, and the Starlight runners are trained by Todd Pletcher.

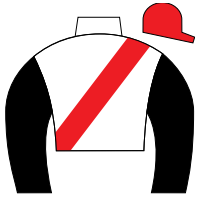

Born in Peru, Prado was a successful jockey in his home country. He moved to the United States and began riding in Florida in 1986. Prado was a leading rider in Maryland before moving his tack to New York and beginning to appear in the biggest races in the sport.

Queen'splatekitten began his career racing at Woodbine for breeders Ken and Sarah Ramsey and trainer Brian Lynch. Four months later, Queen'splatekitten opened his 3-year-old season at Gulfstream Park for new connections: Nicholas F. Brady's Mill House and trainer Todd Pletcher. He won a one-mile allowance race on turf and returned to finish second behind Joes Blazing Aaron in the Palm Beach (G3) on March 12. Joes Blazing Aaron and third-place finisher Newsdad also are making their next starts in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1).

Brady, a former chairman of The Jockey Club, served as the 68th United States Secretary of the Treasury under Presidents Ronald Reagan and George H.W. Bush. During his tenure as Secretary of the Treasury, Brady designed and implemented a successful strategy – called the Brady Plan – to resolve the \$1.3 trillion less-developed nation debt crisis.

John Velazquez, who won the Eclipse Award as North America's outstanding jockey in 2004 and 2005, was the leading rider at Keeneland with 21 victories in the spring of 2005. He has won 120 races at Keeneland prior to this year's spring meeting and is tied for 10th (with Randy Romero) on the list of the track's all-time leading jockeys by stakes wins, with 24.

Velazquez's first stakes victory at Keeneland came in 1994, when he rode Claudius to win the Hopemont. His first Grade 1 win at the track came aboard Perfect Arc in the 1995 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup. For trainer Todd Pletcher, for whom Velazquez has been a successful partner at Keeneland and elsewhere, Velazquez rode Bandini to win the 2005 Toyota Blue Grass (G1).

Velazquez's other Grade 1 wins at Keeneland include the 2009 Vinery Madison on champion Informed Decision. Last year on successful days in April, he won the Grey Goose Bewitch (G3) on Lady Shakespeare and the Fifth Third Elkhorn (G2) on Musketier (GER). Both horses were trained by Roger Attfield.

Born in Puerto Rico, Velazquez began riding in the United States in March 1990 under the guidance of his

agent, Racing Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr. As of early April, he has ridden more than 4,500 winners and the earners of nearly \$251 million around the world. Those wins include nine victories in the Breeders' Cup World Championships, including the 2010 Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) on Uncle Mo. Trained by Pletcher, Uncle Mo was the champion two-year-old male.

Velazquez, 39, serves as chairman of the Jockeys' Guild Board of Directors. His other honors include receiving the 2009 George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award from Santa Anita Park. He is a first-time finalist for election to the Racing Hall of Fame.

Santiva is the only horse in training for owner Tom Walters of Franklin, Indiana. Walters owns Walters & Associates Insurance Services Inc., which the company's website reports is one of Indiana's largest insurance agencies that specializes in long-term care.

Walters, who purchases only one horse a year, bought Santiva as a weanling from breeder Paget Bloodstock. His stable has included two-time stakes winner Elite Squadron, a son of Officer who won the 2008 Churchill Downs (G2) and now stands at Wintergreen Stallion Station near Midway, Kentucky. Walters raced Pretty Prolific, a daughter of Lion Heart, to win the 2010 Sugar Swirl (G3) at Gulfstream Park and run second in last year's Humana Distaff (G1) at Churchill Downs. Pretty Prolific became Walters' first broodmare and was carrying a 2011 foal by Henrythenavigator.

For Walters, Santiva began his career at Saratoga with trainer Ken McPeck, then ran second in the Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (G1) at Keeneland for trainer Todd Pletcher. He won the Kentucky Jockey Club (G2) at Churchill Downs in late November for trainer Eddie Kenneally.

Santiva is the first starter in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1) for trainer Eddie Kenneally, who described the Giant's Causeway colt to Marcus Hersh of Daily Racing Form in February 2011:

"He's just a grinder, a tough little horse," said Kenneally, who was impressed with Santiva's performance when winning the Kentucky Jockey Club (G2) at Churchill Downs last November. "He fought hard that day in Kentucky, and I think that's the kind of horse you need for these 3-year-old races."

Kenneally was raised in Ireland, where his family was involved with horses. He came to the United States in 1987 to work with sales yearlings at Pegasus Stud. Kenneally eventually went to work as an exercise rider for trainer Rusty Arnold at Keeneland and at Payson Park in Florida and later worked for trainers Tom Skiffington and Niall O'Callaghan before becoming private trainer for Elmendorf Farm.

Upon the death of Elmendorf owner Jack Kent Cooke in 1997, Kenneally opened a public stable that is currently based in Kentucky. In 2006, he conditioned Bushfire to win three Grade 1 stakes, including the Ashland at Keeneland, and become a finalist for the Eclipse Award as the year's champion 3-year-old filly. That same year, he sent out Kelly's Landing to win Keeneland's Phoenix Breeders' Cup (G3). The following year, Kelly's Landing captured the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen (G1).

Kenneally sent out his first starter at Keeneland in 1993 and has won a total of 35 races. Joining Bushfire and Kelly's Landing as his Keeneland stakes winners are 2007 Vinery Madison (G2) winner Mary Delaney and 2010 Buffalo Trace Franklin County winner Mimi's Bling.

As of early April, Kenneally has won 460 races and trained the earners of nearly \$17 million.

Jockey: Julien Leparoux

Julien Leparoux, who began riding at Keeneland in 2006, is already one of the track's most successful jockeys. Prior to the 2011 spring race meeting, he is Keeneland's 11th-leading rider by wins (204) and eighth-leading rider by stakes wins (26). Nine of those stakes wins came in 2009, when Leparoux rode such winners as Maker's Mark Mile (G1) winner Karelian during the spring.

Leparoux also owns multiple titles as Keeneland's leading rider. He was the spring meeting's leading rider in 2006 (in a tie with Rafael Bejarano), 2007 and 2009. He was the fall season's leading rider in 2006 and 2010.

Born in France, Leparoux knew as a youngster that he wanted to be a jockey. His late father, Robert, had been a jockey and then an assistant trainer. Leparoux came to the United States in early 2003 to become an exercise rider for fellow countryman Patrick Biancone.

Santiva

He began his riding career at Saratoga in the summer of 2005 and won his first race on August 18 with only his third mount. Since then, Leparoux has earned other leading riding titles at Churchill Downs and at Turfway Park.

Leparoux has received two Eclipse Awards for his riding success. The first was the Eclipse as outstanding apprentice jockey in 2006; he earned the Eclipse Award as outstanding jockey in 2009. Leparoux joins Steve Cauthen, Chris McCarron and Kent Desormeaux as the others to win an Eclipse as an apprentice and as a journeyman.

As of early April, Leparoux had won more than 1,300 races and ridden the earners of nearly \$70 million in his career. His stakes wins this year include the Florida Derby (G1) with Dialed In.

Celebrity chef Bobby Flay enjoyed his most successful day in racing last November when More Than Real won the Breeders' Cup Juveniles Fillies Turf (G2). The More Than Ready filly was saddled by Todd Pletcher, who trains Flay's Toyota Blue Grass (G1) hopeful, Sensational Slam.

Flay first went to the track as a youngster when he accompanied his grandfather to Belmont Park. He became involved in Thoroughbred ownership as a partner with people already established in the business. One of his first ventures was with John Phillips and Richard Santulli, and they raced millionaire Grade 1 winner Wonder Again, who was fourth in the 2005 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1).

In partnership with Robert E. Masterson and Barry Weisbord, Flay raced Keeneland stakes winner Gilded Gold. In 2006, the daughter of Gilded Time won the Giant's Causeway.

Trainer: Todd Pletcher

Todd Pletcher earned four consecutive Eclipse Awards as North America's outstanding trainer (2004-07) and received a fifth Eclipse for 2010 when his stable included 2-year-old champion Uncle Mo and Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winner Super Saver.

At Keeneland, Pletcher was the leading trainer in the spring of 2005, when he trained a spring meeting record 16 winners, and the spring of 2008. Prior to Keeneland's 2011 spring meeting, he has won 134 races

here, tying him for 12th place on the list of the track's all-time leading trainers. Pletcher's 30 stakes wins put him third on the list of track's all-time leading trainers by stakes victories.

Pletcher has two wins in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1). He won the race in 2005 with Bandini. In 2008, he scored a second victory in the race when he sent out Monba to finish a neck in front of stablemate Cowboy Cal.

Pletcher was 7 when he began working with racehorses trained by his father, Jake Pletcher, and he spent his summer vacations at the racetrack. After graduating from the University of Arizona Race Track Industry Program in May 1989, he began working for D. Wayne Lukas, who was inducted into the Racing Hall of Fame in 1999. Their successful association continued until the end of 1995 when Pletcher took out his trainer's license. Pletcher saddled his first winner two months later.

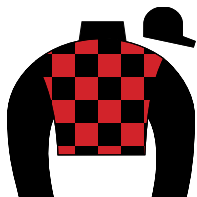
As of early April, Pletcher was the year's leading trainer by earnings with more than \$4.2 million. In his career, he has sent out nearly 2,800 winners and the earners of more than \$202 million, ranking him third on the list of the all-time leading trainers, behind Lukas and the late Hall of Fame trainer Bobby Frankel. On Pletcher's list of champions are Ashado, English Channel, Fleet Indian, Lawyer Ron, Left Bank, Rags to Riches, Speightstown, Uncle Mo and Wait a While.

The Rushaway Stakes on March 26 at Turfway Park marked Swift Warrior's first start for owners James Covello and James Dolan, and the colt rewarded them with a two-length victory in the \$100,000 race.

Swift Warrior began his career in South Florida at Calder Race Course, where he placed in two stakes for owner-trainer Steve Dwoskin. He drew the attention of Jerry Brown, owner of Thoro-Graph, which assigns performance figures for horses based on various details their races.

Covello purchased Swift Warrior based on the recommendation of Brown and bloodstock agent Nick Sallusto, who inspected the horse on his behalf. Swift Warrior is now one of 10 horses Covello and various partners have in training with John Terranova II, whom Covello met through Sallusto. Another is Lilacs and Lace, who won Keeneland's Central Bank Ashland (G1) on April 9 at odds of 48-1. Covello owns the Flower Alley filly in partnership with Judy Hicks and Kathryn Nikkel.

Covello, who lives in New Providence, New Jersey, works in New York City at Goldman Sachs, where he is a stock researcher analyst who covers tech companies. He was introduced to racing by his wife, Terri, soon after they were married when they attended the races at Saratoga Race Course, which is located near where her family has lived.

Covello first became involved in owning racehorses through several partnership groups, one of which included Dolan, who owns a corporate tiling company. Coincidentally, the two men live only three blocks from each other. Covello was one of the partners who raced Patena, 10th in the 2009 Toyota Blue Grass.

The Covellos and their three children – ages 4, 6 and 8 – planned to spend several days this week in Central Kentucky to visit their broodmares at Nicole Hammond's December Farm in Midway and do some sightseeing.

Trainer: John Terranova II

John Terranova II scored his first victory as a trainer at Keeneland in April 1993 with I'm No Quacker and has three stakes wins at the track with a trio of talented fillies. He sent out Laragh to win the JPMorgan Chase Jessamine in 2008, Neglige to win Keeneland's Darley Alcibiades (G1) in 2009 and Grade 1 winner Franny Freud to win the Beaumont (G2) in the spring of 2010. On April 9, he sent out 48-1 longshot Lilacs and Lace to win the Central Bank Ashland (G1).

Terranova learned about racing from his father, who had horses in training with Dominic Imperio and Allen Jerkins. He went to Boston College to study business but took a leave of absence to work at the track and never returned to school. After working as an assistant to Imperio, he took out his trainer's license in 1993. Among his early stars was Gander, the 2000 New York Horse of the Year and champion older horse.

Terranova's wife, Tonja, plays a key role in the training operation and also serves as an assistant to Racing Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert when he runs horses in New York. She sent out River Keen (IRE) to win two Grade 1 races at Belmont Park for Baffert. Another Baffert runners under their care was two-time champion Indian Blessing.

As of early April, Terranova has won nearly 270 races and sent out the earners of nearly \$14 million.

Swift Warrior

Jockey: Garrett Gomez

Based in Southern California for most of his career, Garrett “Go-Go” Gomez moved his tack to Keeneland for the 2010 spring season and was the meeting’s leading rider with 22 victories from 68 mounts. His record was boosted by a three-win day and victories in the Doubledogdare (G3) aboard Haka and the Beaumont (G2) with Franny Freud.

A year later, Gomez is back to defend his title, and he is a first-time finalist for election into the Racing Hall of Fame this year.

Gomez won the Eclipse Award for Outstanding Jockey in 2007 and 2008 and led all North American riders in earnings from 2006 through 2009. He won a record 76 stakes races in 2007 and has 12 Breeders’ Cup wins to his credit, including three victories in 2010: Breeders’ Cup Classic (G1) aboard champion Blame; Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Turf (G2) on Pluck and Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G2) on More Than Real. Gomez also rode Kinsale King to win the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen (G1) at Meydan Racecourse in

Dubai.

Gomez, who is from Tucson, Arizona, began his career in September 1988 at the now-defunct Downs at Santa Fe in New Mexico. He rode the fair circuit before moving to Nebraska’s Fonner Park and Ak-Sar-Ben. Gomez was the second-leading apprentice of 1989 with 182 winners.

As of early April, Gomez has ridden more than 3,400 winners and the earners of more than \$183 million in his career. At Keeneland, Gomez has won 99 races, including 21 stakes, prior to the 2011 spring season. His first stakes win at the track came in 1994 when he rode Southern Rhythm to win the Lexington (G2). He scored his lone victory in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1) in 2006 when he rode Sinister Minister to a 12 3/4-length win for trainer Bob Baffert.

Oklahoma native E.K. "Ed" Gaylord II breeds and races horses as Gaillardia Racing, naming the operation after the French version of his last name.

Gaylord's late father, Edward L. Gaylord, co-owned 1980 Kentucky Derby (G1) runner-up Rumbo. In 1984, after pari-mutuel racing became legal in Oklahoma, the younger Gaylord opened the Lazy E Ranch near Oklahoma City and developed it into one of the Southwest's leading Thoroughbred and American Quarter Horse breeding operations. He sold the ranch in 2005.

The younger Gaylord, an original member of the A.P. Indy syndicate, has had a successful breeding and sales operation. At the 2001 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, he sold a Mr. Prospector colt later named Hoyer for \$3.8 million to Godolphin Racing representative John Ferguson. Among the horses he bred (in the name of Lazy E Ranch) was Grade 1 winner Voodoo Dancer.

Gaylord acquired Wilkinson's dam, Tasha's Delight, after her second start in 2005. The daughter of Afternoon Deelites, who placed in four stakes for Gaillardia, now resides at William S. Farish's Lane's End near Versailles, Kentucky. Lane's End stands Wilkinson's sire, Lemon Drop Kid.

The Gaylord family has had widespread business interests that include media, entertainment and hospitality. They include the *Daily Oklahoman* newspaper in Oklahoma City and the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville. E.K. Gaylord is currently the chairman and owner of Gaylord Sports Management and a director of the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City.

Trainer: Neil Howard

Neil Howard's first Keeneland stakes winner was Summer Squall, who in 1990 won the Blue Grass (then a Grade 2 race) and went on to win the Preakness (G1). Entering the 2011 spring meeting, Howard has won a total of 150 races, including 19 stakes, at Keeneland, ranking him eighth on the list of the track's all-time leading trainers in both categories. He and D. Wayne Lukas shared the title of leading trainer for the 1994 spring season when each saddled seven winners.

From Riverdale, New York, Howard was involved with hunter/jumpers as a teen and was first exposed to racing in the late 1960s when he visited Waterford Park in West Virginia in search of show prospects. He gained his initial racetrack experience in 1969 working for trainer John Cotter, and later worked for such prominent horsemen as Joe Cantey and Racing Hall of Fame trainers Woody Stephens and Mack Miller. He began training on his own in the spring of 1979.

In 1984, Howard became the private trainer for Will Farish's Lane's End and developed such horses as 2003 Horse of the Year Mineshaft; Prospectors Delite, winner of Keeneland's Ashland (G1) in 1992; and 2000 Kentucky Oaks (G1) winner Secret Status. Howard became a public trainer in 2010.

In his career, Howard has trained more than 1,100 winners and the earners of more than \$46 million. He also trained Grade 1 stakes winners America Alive, Runup the Colors, Shadow Cast and Tomisue's Delight.

Jockey: Robby Albarado

Robby Albarado is the third-winningest rider in Keeneland history (with 414 victories through 2010) and is fourth by stakes wins (with 44). He has scored Grade 1 victories aboard Banshee Breeze, Elloluv, Nothing to Lose, Wicked Style, Dream Empress, Thorn Song and Court Vision. Last year, Albarado won the Coolmore Lexington (G2) on Exhi.

Wilkinson

From Louisiana, Albarado is among the sport's accomplished jockeys who got their start competing at bush tracks in Cajun Country. He rode his first recognized winner in 1990 at Evangeline Downs, and competed throughout Louisiana, Arkansas and Chicago before moving to the Kentucky circuit in the spring of 1996. Albarado has been the leading rider at Keeneland (Spring 2002 and 2003, and Fall 2008 and 2009), as well as Churchill Downs, Fair Grounds, Arlington Park and Oaklawn Park.

As of early April, Albarado had ridden nearly 4,300 winners and the earners of more than \$171 million. His mounts include two horses named Horse of the Year, Mineshaft (2003) and Curlin (2007-2008). Neil Howard, who trains Wilkinson, conditioned Mineshaft.

Albarado is a member of the Jockeys' Guild Board of Directors. His Robby Albarado Foundation (RobbyAlbaradoFoundation.org) is a non-profit organization that assists homeless, socially-economically disadvantaged and less fortunate people in the Louisville area.

All In Stable is a partnership that includes trainer Michael Stidham and several longtime associates. Stidham owns a quarter-interest in Willcox Inn with Hillary Pridham, his assistant, and Marrette Farrell, a bloodstock agent based in Lexington.

The remaining three-quarter ownership of Willcox Inn is divided equally among John Adger of Houston, who is the former bloodstock manager for Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside Stable; Jack Hodge of the Seattle area, who is vice president of Northwest Racing Association LP and Emerald Downs; and Three Kings Stable of Chicago. Brothers Al and Ron Lepinsky and Marty Nixon make up the Three Kings.

Trainer: Mike Stidham

Willcox Inn, named for a hotel in Aiken, South Carolina, is the first starter in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1) for trainer Mike Stidham, who has spent a lifetime in horse racing. His late father, George, was a jockey and later served as business manager and part-time agent for Racing Hall of Fame jockey Bill Hartack before becoming a trainer.

Born in New Jersey, the younger Stidham learned about racing from his father, starting as hotwalker and groom and become an assistant trainer. He spent two years in college, setting his sights on becoming a veterinarian before deciding to become trainer. He worked for his father in South Florida before going on his own at Tampa Bay Downs in 1978. He moved to California in the early 1980s and trained for Elmendorf Farm then returned to Florida to train for Meadowbrook Farm. He now trains in the Midwest, in Louisiana, Texas, Kentucky and Illinois.

At Keeneland, Stidham sent out his first starter in 1994. Through 2010, he has won 25 races at the track, including the 2000 Appalachian with Impending Bear and the 2001 Appalachian with Bold Answer.

As of early April, Stidham has won more than 1,200 races and sent out the earners of nearly \$38 million. Among them are Grade 1 winners Sutra, owned by Jack Hodge of All In Stable, and Two Altazano.

Jockey: Rosie Napravnik

A.R. "Rosie" Napravnik is coming off a dominating performance at Fair Grounds, where she was the leading rider with 110 victories. That total not only made her the first female jockey to lead the standings at the New Orleans track, but was 31 wins ahead of runner-up Shaun Bridgmohan. Among Napravnik's victories was the Louisiana Derby (G2) aboard Pants On Fire, whom she will ride in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) to become the first female jockey to compete in the race since 2003.

Born in Morristown, New Jersey, Napravnik, 23, grew up with horses. Her sister, Jasmine "Jazz" Napravnik, also has ridden Thoroughbreds. Rosie began her riding career in 2005 and won aboard her first mount. She was the leading rider in Maryland in 2006 and was runner-up to Julien Leparoux for the Eclipse Award as outstanding apprentice rider. Napravnik, who has spent time riding at Aqueduct, was the leading rider at Delaware Park last year.

Napravnik had ridden in just four races at Keeneland prior to the start of racing in 2011, and one of those races resulted in a milestone. Last October, she rode Fugitive Angel to win the Pin Oak Valley View (G3) for her first stakes victory at the track. Fugitive Angel was trained by Racing Hall of Fame trainer Jonathan Sheppard, for whom Napravnik worked a summer on his Pennsylvania farm when she was 13.

As of early April, Napravnik has ridden more than 1,100 winners and the earners of nearly \$29 million. She joins Patti Cooksey, Tammy Fox and Julie Krone as other female jockeys with mounts in the Blue Grass, Keeneland's richest and most famous race.
