Toyota Blue Grass Stakes

The \$750,000 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) on April 10 is Keeneland's richest and most famous race and an important stop on the road to the \$2 million Kentucky Derby presented by Yum! Brands (G1). Run three weeks before the Kentucky Derby, the Toyota Blue Grass is a 1 1/8-mile test for 3-year-old Thoroughbreds with proven ability and those with emerging talents.

Named for the famous Bluegrass region of Central Kentucky, the Blue Grass first was held in 1911 at the old Kentucky Association track near downtown Lexington. The race quickly proved to be an important contest for 3-year-olds as Blue Grass second-place finishers Meridian (1911), Donerail (1913) and Behave Yourself (1921) went on to win the Kentucky Derby. In 1926, the final year the race was held at the Kentucky Association track, Bubbling Over became the first horse to win the Blue Grass and the Kentucky Derby.

In April 1937, Keeneland held its inaugural spring meeting and ran the Blue Grass for the first time. On April 29, Maxwell Howard's Fencing defeated five rivals to win the \$5,000-added event.

Since then, a total of nine winners of the Blue Grass have won the Kentucky Derby and another nine horses who ran in the race have won the Run for the Roses. Among the Blue Grass-Kentucky Derby winners are some of the most famous Thoroughbreds in history, including Racing Hall of Fame members Northern Dancer, Riva Ridge and Spectacular Bid.

In the summer of 2006, Keeneland underwent a massive renovation that included reconfiguring the racetrack and installing the revolutionary Polytrack racing surface. Keeneland's new racetrack, which drew attention from inside and outside the Thoroughbred industry, debuted for the fall meeting of 2006.

The first Toyota Blue Grass to be run on Polytrack took place on April 14, 2007. The race produced one of the most exciting finishes of the entire year in Thoroughbred racing as less than a neck separated the first four horses at the wire. The winner was Silverton Hill LLC's Dominican, who nosed out champion and eventual Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense.

In 2008, trainer Todd Pletcher saddled the first two finishers of the Toyota Blue Grass when Monba, owned by Jack Wolf's Starlight Stable, Donald Lucarelli and Paul H. Saylor, defeated stablemate Cowboy Cal. Last year,

General Quarters – owned and trained by former high school principal Tom McCarthy, who was 75 at the time – won the race at odds of 14-1.

This year, the Toyota Blue Grass is among 16 stakes worth a total of \$3.65 million that Keeneland is holding during its 15-day spring meeting from April 2-23. For more information, visit ToyotaBlueGrassStakes.com and Keeneland.com.

Toyota's sponsorship of the Blue Grass Stakes

In 1957, the year Round Table won the Blue Grass Stakes at Keeneland, Toyota established a presence in the United States by setting up shop in a former Rambler dealership in Hollywood, California. Sales began in 1958 and totaled 288 vehicles: 287 Toyopet Crown sedans and one Land Cruiser.

Over the next several years, Toyota vehicles became so popular in this country that the Japanese automaker began to build manufacturing plants across the U.S.

In the 1980s, Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky (TMMK) built a plant in nearby Georgetown and in 1988 began producing the popular Camry. In 1996, Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky, five area Toyota dealerships and Toyota Motor Sales in Cincinnati teamed up to sponsor the Blue Grass Stakes, marking Toyota's first sponsorship of a horse race. As part of the sponsorship agreement, Keeneland replaces vehicles in its fleet with Toyotas.

Toyota's \$4 billion, state-of-the-art automotive complex in Georgetown is Toyota's largest production facility outside of Japan. The Georgetown facility has the capacity to produce 500,000 vehicles and engines annually with nearly 7,000 employees. Its products include the Camry, Camry Hybrid, Avalon and Venza. Meanwhile, Toyota relies on numerous suppliers from Kentucky and elsewhere in the United States.

Toyota hired team members from nearly every one of Kentucky's 120 counties and continues its philosophy of giving back to the communities where team members live. Since arriving in Georgetown in 1986, TMMK has distributed more than \$32 million in gifts and sponsorships across Kentucky.

In March, W. Cothran "Cot" Campbell of Dogwood Stable said that Aikenite doesn't have to win the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) to proceed to the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), but he said the colt does have to run "awfully well."

"Aikenite's disposition and running style are well suited for an appearance in the Derby," Campbell said. "His \$251,000 in earnings is already adequate to get him in the starting field for the Kentucky Derby. He acts as if he would belong, but the Blue Grass will solidify our thoughts on the matter."

Dogwood Stable is one of Thoroughbred racing's most successful and well-known owners. In 1969, Campbell was chairman of an advertising agency in Atlanta when he purchased a racehorse with several friends. From that beginning, he formulated the idea of group ownership of Thoroughbred racehorses, and Dogwood Stable was born. Highlights include 73 stakes winners; six trips to the Kentucky Derby (G1); a Preakness (G1) winner in Summer Squall; six millionaires; two champions in Storm Song and steeplechaser Inlander; and a Breeders' Cup victory.

Up until 1990, most Dogwood partnerships were based on 40 shares of a five-horse package, according to Dogwood's website. There were 28 people who purchased the 40 shares of the package that included Summer Squall. Now Dogwood partnerships are closely held four- and eight-share general partnerships. Dogwood Stable, one of the general partners, owns a five-percent interest in each partnership. Campbell acts as racing manager. The Dogwood website reports that this partnership arrangement offers more favorable tax benefits than the old 40-share package.

Dogwood's headquarters are in Aiken, South Carolina, a popular training area. Its current roster includes 52 horses, from 2-year-olds to veteran runners, that compete at tracks in the East and Midwest.

At Keeneland, Dogwood horses have won seven stakes, starting with Mrs. Cornwallis in the 1971 Alcibiades. Summer Squall won the 1990 Blue Grass (then a Grade 2 race) and the 1991 Fayette (G2). After his racing career, Summer Squall became a successful sire.

Dogwood also is on the verge of a unique honor at Keeneland, which awards a gold julep cup to the winning owner of a graded stakes race. An owner who receives eight of these cups is awarded the Keeneland Tray, a solid gold serving piece. When Dogwood wins its next graded stakes at Keeneland, it will receive its eighth gold julep cup to earn the Keeneland Tray.

Trainer: Todd Pletcher

Todd Pletcher, who earned four consecutive Eclipse Awards as North America's outstanding trainer (2004-2007), saddled the first two finishers in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1) in 2008. He won the race with Monba, who finished a neck in front of stablemate Cowboy Cal. Monba gave Pletcher his second victory in the Toyota Blue Grass, following Bandini's triumph in 2005.

At Keeneland, Pletcher was the leading trainer in the spring of 2005, when he trained a spring-meet record 16 winners, and the spring of 2008. Prior to Keeneland's 2010 spring meeting, he had won 122 races, including 27 stakes, at the track and is third on the list of track's all-time leading trainers by stakes victories. His first Keeneland stakes win came with Turkappeal in the 1996 Valley View during his first full year as a trainer.

Pletcher was seven when he began working with racehorses trained by his father, Jake Pletcher, and he spent his summer vacations at the racetrack. After graduating from the University of Arizona Race Track Industry

Program in May 1989, he began working for D. Wayne Lukas, who was inducted into the Racing Hall of Fame in 1999. Their successful association continued until the end of 1995 when Pletcher took out his trainer's license. Pletcher saddled his first winner two months later.

As of April 4, Pletcher had sent out 2,509 winners and the earners of \$180 million in his career. He is fourth on the list of North America's all-time leading trainers by earnings behind Lukas, the late Bobby Franke and Bill Mott.

Pletcher also ranked as North America's leading trainer by earnings with more than \$5 million for the season. His current-year record as of April 4 included 24 stakes wins from graded stakes-winning 3-year-olds Eskendereya, Mission Impazible and Rule and other horses, including Grade 1 winner Quality Road. On April 3, Eskendereya won the Wood Memorial (G1) by 9 3/4 lengths to become the early favorite for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

On Pletcher's roster of champions are Ashado, English Channel, Fleet Indian, Lawyer Ron, Left Bank, Rags to Riches, Speightstown and Wait a While.

Jockey: Garrett Gomez

Garrett "Go-Go" Gomez, who earned Eclipse Awards as outstanding jockey in 2007 and 2008, was North America's leading rider by earnings in 2009 with \$18,571,171. Last year marked the fourth consecutive year in which Gomez led all riders in North America by earnings.

Based in Southern California for most of his career, Gomez moved his tack to Keeneland for April and planned to head eastward as the year progresses. In 2006, Gomez competed in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1) for the first time and piloted Sinister Minister to a 12 3/4-length victory in the race.

Gomez, who is from Tucson, Arizona, began his career in September 1988 at the now-defunct Downs at Santa Fe in New Mexico. He rode the fair circuit before moving to Nebraska's Fonner Park and Ak-Sar-Ben. Gomez was the second-leading apprentice of 1989 with 182 winners.

As of April 4, Gomez had ridden more than 3,300 winners and the earners of more than \$167 million in his career. On March 27, he rode Kinsale King to win the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1).

Gomez's mounts this year also have included champion Lookin At Lucky, Richard's Kid and Conveyance for Racing Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert. Last year, he rode Life Is Sweet to win the Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic (G1) and eventual Canadian Horse of the Year Champs Elysees (GB) to win the Pattison Canadian International Stakes at Woodbine. Other career highlights include riding four winners during the Breeders' Cup World Championships in 2008.

At Keeneland, Gomez has won 69 races, including 19 stakes, prior to the 2010 spring season. His first stakes win at the track came in 1994 when he rode Southern Rhythm to win the Lexington (G2). He has won other Grade 1 races at the track aboard Plenty of Light in the 2000 Spinster, on Aussie Rules in the 2006 Shadwell Turf Mile and on Panty Raid in the 2007 Juddmonte Spinster. In the spring of 2009, he won the Coolmore Lexington (G2) on Advice.

The members of Bred to Win Partners LLC are brothers Larry and Jim Doyle and Frank Costa and his daughter, Kitty, of New York. Kitty came up with the name of Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) hopeful Codoy by combining a portion of the partners' last names.

The Doyles and Costas have been longtime friends of trainer Mark Hubley, who also is from New York. In 2000, the Doyles encouraged Hubley to return to training after he had been away from the sport for several years. In 2007, Hubley added the job of managing Larry Doyle's new KatieRich Farm in Midway, Kentucky, while Doyle continues to maintain his own residence in Westchester County, New York. Doyle named the farm after his two children.

Larry Doyle is chairman and co-founder of Kinetics Asset Management, which manages investments and mutual funds. Jim Doyle, who lives in Saratoga, is counsel for a securities firm.

Trainer: Mark Hubley

Born in New York City, Mark Hubley is the son of three-time Academy Award-winning film makers John and Faith Hubley. When he was four in the late 1950s, Mark provided the voice of "Marky Maypo," the cowboy who wouldn't eat his Maypo hot cereal until his dad tried it and liked it. The line "I Want My Maypo" became famous.

Despite his background, Hubley gravitated to horses. After graduating from Reed College in Oregon

in 1974 with a BA in English literature, he worked for a time for Monty Roberts, who was a consignor of 2-year-olds before Roberts gained fame as a "horse whisperer." Hubley returned to New York in 1979 and began training in 1980, scoring his first win at Aqueduct with a horse named Eddie's Luck.

Hubley trained horses until 1995, then left racing for a time while he worked in special education in New York. He returned to racing in 2000 and moved to Kentucky and began to train at The Thoroughbred Center in 2005. In 2007, Hubley also became the manager of Larry Doyle's KatieRich Farm in Midway, Kentucky. Hubley and Doyle are longtime friends.

As of April 1, Hubley had trained 149 winners and the earners of more than \$2.3 million. He has trained three stakes winners: Miss City Halo, winner of the 2002 Martha Washington Stakes at Oaklawn Park; Eltawaasul, winner of the 2003 Battlefield Stakes at Monmouth Park; and Miss Red Delicious, who won the 2007 Anna M. Fisher Debutante at Ellis Park.

Jockey: John Velazquez

John Velazquez, who won the Eclipse Award as North America's outstanding jockey in 2004 and 2005, was the leading rider at Keeneland with 21 victories in the spring of 2005. He has won 103 Keeneland races, including 22 stakes, prior to this year's spring meeting. Velazquez is 10th on the list of Keeneland's all-time leading jockeys by stakes wins.

Velazquez's first stakes victory at Keeneland came in 1994, when he rode Claudius to win the Hopemont. His first Grade 1 win at the track came aboard Perfect Arc in the 1995 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup. For trainer Todd Pletcher, for whom Velazquez has been a successful partner at Keeneland and elsewhere, Velazquez rode Bandini to win the 2005 Toyota Blue Grass (G1).

In 2009 at Keeneland, Velazquez rode eventual champion Informed Decision to win the Vinery Madison (G1), and he rode Eye of Taurus to win the second division of the Pin Oak Valley View (G3).

Born in Puerto Rico, Velazquez began riding in the United States in March 1990 under the guidance of his agent, Racing Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr. Prior to the start of Keeneland's 2010 spring season, he had ridden nearly 4,300 winners and the earners of more than \$233 million around the world. Those wins include

seven victories in the Breeders' Cup World Championships. For Pletcher this year, his graded stakes-winning mounts include 3-year-olds Eskendereya and Rule and 4-year-old Quality Road.

Velazquez serves as chairman of the Jockeys' Guild Board of Directors. He received the 2009 George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award from Santa Anita Park.

Brothers Alain and Gerard Wertheimer represent the third generation of a family that has enjoyed global success as Thoroughbred breeders and owners. Their grandfather Pierre was a bastion of the European turf, and their father, Jacques, was a champion owner in France. The Wertheimers have been responsible for the development of a number of influential stallions, including Lyphard, Riverman and Green Dancer.

Alan and Gerard Wertheimer's most notable horses include two-time Breeders' Cup Mile (G1) winner Goldikova (Ire), who received the Eclipse Award as champion turf female for 2009; champion Halfbridled, who won the 2003 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1); and 1993 Horse of the Year Kotashaan (Fr), who won that year's Breeders' Cup Turf (G1). All three runners are homebreds. Goldikova represents at least five generations of horses bred by the Wertheimer family.

At Keeneland, the Wertheimers won the 2005 Doubledogdare with homebred Colony Band. Todd Pletcher, who conditions Interactif, trained Colony Band, who began her racing career in France and made her career finale in the Doubledogdare. Pletcher conditions the Wertheimer runners in the United States; Goldikova and the brothers' European runners are trained by Freddie Head.

The Wertheimers are senior members of the family that owns the world-famous Chanel perfume manufacturing business that also sells high-end clothing and accessories. They inherited Chanel upon the death of their father in 1986.

Interactif also is from a notable family. His third dam is Racing Hall of Fame member Personal Ensign, who was undefeated in 13 career races.

Jockey: Rafael Bejarano

Keeneland has been an important component in the career of Rafael Bejarano, who is North America's leading rider of 2010 by earnings with more than \$3.2 million. He has won four riding titles at the track: Fall 2004, Fall 2005, Spring 2006 (tie) and Fall 2007. In October 2005, he scored the 1,000th victory of his career when he rode Northern Vacation to a win at Keeneland. In 2007, Bejarano rode Dominican to win the Toyota Blue Grass (G1) for his first victory in Keeneland's most famous race.

Bejarano had won 172 races, including 16 stakes, at Keeneland prior to the start of racing in 2010. His

first stakes win at the track came in 2004 when he won six stakes, including the Lane's End Breeders' Futurity (G1) with Consolidator. Bejarano's subsequent Grade 1 wins at Keeneland came in 2005, when he won the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup with Sweet Talker and the Shadwell Turf Mile with Host (CHI). In 2007, he also won the Darley Alcibiades (G1) on Country Star. In 2008, Bejarano rode Square Eddie to win the Lane's End Breeders' Futurity (G1).

From Peru, Bejarano is now based in Southern California. In 2008, he was the leading rider at the five major race meetings in Southern California and joined Chris McCarron and Pat Valenzuela as the jockeys to accomplish the feat.

In his career, Bejarano has won a number of important races en route to winning more than 2,100 races and riding the earners of nearly \$93 million as of April 1. In 2007, he rode Ginger Punch to win the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1). In 2005, he rode Intercontinental (GB) to win the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1).

This year, Bejarano has won graded stakes on Blind Luck, Bourbon Bay and Tuscan Evening (IRE).

This year, Peter Johnson is involved with two stakes-winning 3-year-olds, already making for a good season by many standards. With his wife, Ellen, Johnson owns Toyota Blue Grass (G1) hopeful Make Music for Me, who is coming off a win in the Pasadena Stakes on turf at Santa Anita. At 2, the Kentucky-bred son of Bernstein finished second and third to eventual division champion Lookin At Lucky in two Grade 1 races in Southern California. Make Music For Me also finished fourth at Keeneland in the Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (G1).

With breeder Teresa McWilliams, Johnson races Alphonse's Bet, a California-bred son of Tribal Rule that McWilliams also bred. Winner of the Sham Stakes (G3) on March 6, Alphonse's Bet finished sixth in the Santa Anita Derby (G1) on April 3.

Johnson, who lives in Santa Barbara, California, is a member of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association.

Trainer: Alexis Barba

When she sent out a pair of 3-year-olds to win stakes on March 6 at Santa Anita, California-based trainer Alexis Barba introduced herself to many fans of Thoroughbred racing. Barba, who trains just six horses, won the Pasadena Stakes with Make Music for Me and a half-hour later saddled Alphonse's Bet to win the Sham Stakes (G3). Alphonse's Bet, a California-bred colt by Tribal Rule, races for Peter O. Williams and breeder Teresa McWilliams. Make Music for Me, a Kentucky-bred colt by Bernstein, races for Williams and his wife, Ellen.

Now Make Music for Me is becoming Barba's first starter in the Toyota Blue Grass (G1). Prior to the 2010

spring season, Barba had saddled only one horse at Keeneland. That was Make Music for Me, who finished fourth behind Noble's Promise in the Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (G1) in October 2009.

Barba, who became interested in racing after someone gave her a Thoroughbred, was involved with show horses before she began working at Golden Gate Fields in Northern California. She later worked as an assistant to the late trainer Eddie Gregson, who ventured to Keeneland several times during his career. In 1982, Gregson sent out Gato Del Sol to run second to Linkage in the Blue Grass and go on to win the Kentucky Derby (G1). In 1986, Gregson sent out Icy Groom to run fourth in the Blue Grass, won by Bachelor Beau.

Since 2000, Barba had won 37 races and saddled the earners of more than \$1.7 million in her career as of April 4.

Jockey: Mike Smith

As the jockey of Zenyatta, Mike Smith has experienced perfection on the racetrack. Zenyatta has won all 15 of her career races, including last year's Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) against males, and she received the Eclipse Award as champion older mare in 2008 and 2009. On April 9, Zenyatta is scheduled to race in the Apple Blossom Handicap (G1) at Oaklawn Park.

Zenyatta is one of the many outstanding horses Smith has ridden during a career that includes his 2003 induction into the Racing Hall of Fame. Smith won the 2005 Kentucky Derby (G1) on Giacomo and the 1993 Preakness (G1) on Prairie Bayou after he scored his first win on the gelding in the Blue Grass Stakes. His other outstanding mounts include Azeri, Holy Bull, Lure, Skip Away, Unbridled's Song and Vindication.

From Roswell, New Mexico, Smith began his career on unrecognized tracks in the area and rode his first official winner at the now-defunct Downs at Santa Fe. Earlier in his career, Smith was a frequent member of the Keeneland riding colony and was the leading jockey during the 1994 spring season with 22 wins.

Through 2009, Smith had won 24 stakes at Keeneland, tying him for eighth on the list of all-time leading Keeneland jockeys by stakes wins. He won his first stakes at the track in 1987, guiding Exclusive Enough

Make Music for Me

to win the Commonwealth Breeders' Cup. Among the highlights are two victories in the Toyota Blue Grass; riding Inside Information to win the 1994 Ashland (G1) and 1995 Spinster (G1); and winning the Ashland again in 1997 with Glitter Woman.

Smith has ridden nearly 4,900 winners and the earners of nearly \$208 million in his career. The latter figure ranks him 10th among North America's leading jockeys.

Satish Sanan and his wife, Anne, own Padua Stables, one of Thoroughbred racing's most successful owners. In 1997, the Sanans bought the first six Padua horses at the Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale and a year later established a farm in Ocala, Florida. Since then, Padua has raced horses in major races across the country. Standouts include champion Vindication, a \$2.5 million purchase at the 2001 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Vindication won the 2002 Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1).

Padua's other Breeders' Cup winners are Cash Run and Cajun Beat (the latter owned in partnership with John and Joseph Iracane). Purchased for \$1.2 million at the 1998 Keeneland July sale, Cash Run won the 1999 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) with trainer D. Wayne Lukas. In 2003, the daughter of Seeking the Gold was sold in foal to Storm Cat for \$7.1 million at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.

Cajun Beat, purchased at the 2000 Keeneland November sale for \$145,000, won the 2003 Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) for trainer Steve Margolis.

At Keeneland, Padua has won five stakes with horses owned singly and in various partnerships. Stakes victories include the 2004 Coolmore Lexington (G2) with Quintons Gold Rush, raced in partnership with Jay Manoogian, and the 2008 Coolmore Lexington (G2) with Behindatthebar, owned in partnership with Michael Shustek and W. Don Stanley.

Padua also raced Yes It's True to win the 1999 Lafayette (G3) and now stands the son of Is It True in

Kentucky at Three Chimneys Farm. On opening day of the Keeneland spring season, Nordic Truce, a son of Yes It's True, won the Transylvania (G3).

Satish Sanan is a member of the board of Breeders' Cup Ltd. He also was instrumental in creating the Alliance for Industry Reform, an organization dedicated to creating standards governing Thoroughbred sales practices.

Trainer: Tom Albertrani

New York-based trainer Tom Albertrani was 13 when he went to work walking hots and grooming horses for his uncle, trainer Jack Abatemarco. He eventually became a jockey, winning 29 races over parts of six years. From there, Albertrani became an assistant to trainer Mark Casse and continued to gallop horses. He became an assistant to trainer Bill Mott in New York, and he later worked for other notable trainers.

In 1995, Godolphin Racing hired Albertrani, who became a top assistant with the main Godolphin string of trainer Saeed bin Suroor. While Albertrani worked with bin Suroor, Godolphin won 85 Grade 1 and Group 1 races. In 2003, Albertrani began training in New York full-time with 10 horses for Darley, all owned by members of the Maktoum royal family of Dubai. Two years later, he opened a public stable for the first time with the permission of Darley to take on some outside clients

Albertrani registered his first official stakes winner as a trainer of record in September of 2004, with Swither in the \$250,000 NATC Sorority Futurity at Delaware Park for Darley. In 2006, Albertrani moved into the national spotlight with Darley's Bernardini, who won five consecutive stakes, including the Preakness (G1), Travers (G1) and Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1). Bernardini was second to eventual Horse of the Year Invasor (ARG) in that year's Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and became the year's champion 3-year-old colt.

As of April 1, Albertrani had won 234 races and had trained the earners of more than \$16 million. His stakes winners also include Grade 1 winners Balletto (UAE) and Gozzip Girl.

Odysseus

Jockey: Rajiv Maragh

Rajiv Maragh, 24, learned about racing from his father, Collin, a jockey in his native Jamaica who later embarked on a training career in South Florida. After graduating from high school, Maragh began to work at farms in Florida and galloped horses for his father, who gave him his first opportunity to ride competitively in 2003. He scored his first win at Tampa Bay Downs in February 2004.

Maragh caught the eye of Racing Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr., who brought him to New York in 2004. Maragh first rode at Keeneland in 2008 and through 2009 had won a total of five stakes at the track, scoring Grade 1 wins aboard Little Belle in the 2008 Ashland, Diamondrella (GB) in the 2009 First Lady and Negligee in the 2009 Darley Alcibiades.

On February 28, Maragh scored the 1,000th victory of his career when he won the fourth race at Gulfstream Park. He has ridden the earners of nearly \$38 million in his career, including other Grade 1 winners Music Note and Seventh Street. On March 27, Maragh rode Mission Impazible to win the Louisiana Derby (G2).

Donegal Racing represents a partnership named for the county in Ireland where the ancestors of one of the members, Jerry Crawford, lived. Crawford's partners are Dennis Albaugh, Jason Loutsch, Gary Kirk, George Cataldo, William Jacobson and Judy Smith. All are from the Des Moines, Iowa, area, where Crawford is managing owner of the Iowa Energy, an NBA Development League team.

In 2008, the partners came together to form Derby Dreams, which spent \$500,000 on eight yearlings with the goal of reaching the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1). Paddy O'Prado was consigned to the 2008 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, where trainer Dale Romans, agent, purchased the El Prado (IRE) colt for \$105,000.

At the same sale, Crawford, with Romans as agent, purchased Vow to Wager, a son of Broken Vow, for \$90,000. On February 27, Vow to Wager was elevated to first place in the John Battaglia Memorial Stakes upon the disqualification of Toyota Blue Grass (G1) starter Codoy. Vow to Wager returned to run fifth in the Lane's End Stakes (G2).

"All I know for sure is this is the most exciting time of my life in horse racing," Crawford told Dan Johnson of the *Des Moines Register*. "I've always heard the phrase 'Derby fever,' but I didn't know what a debilitating disease it could be. I can smell it, feel it, absolutely. I'm so excited for all of our partners. They're having the time of their lives."

Trainer: Dale Romans

Dale Romans is coming off a year in which he won two million-dollar races: the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf with Tapitsfly and the Delaware Handicap (G2) with Swift Temper. In 2009, Romans' stable earned \$5,194,218, ranking him 18th among North America's leading trainers by earnings.

Romans' father, Jerry Romans, who died in 2000, was a successful trainer on the Kentucky circuit. The younger Romans grew up working for his father and took out his first trainer's license when he was 19. In 1993, he won his first stakes at Keeneland when Little Shocker captured the Indian Summer. Among his other career highlights are training champion Kitten's Joy and winning the 2005 Dubai World Cup (UAE-G1) with Roses in May.

Romans is a two-time leading trainer at Keeneland, earning titles for the 2001 and 2002 fall meetings. Based at Churchill Downs, he also has been the leading trainer at the Louisville track, as well as at Turfway Park.

At Keeneland prior to the start of racing this year, Romans had won five stakes. In 2005, he captured one of the fall meet's most important races, the Lane's End Breeders' Futurity (G1) for 2-year-olds, with Dawn of War. During the 2008 fall season, he sent out Thorn Song to win the Shadwell Turf Mile (G1).

In his career, Romans has saddled more than 1,300 winners and the earners of more than \$56 million.

Jockey: Kent Desormeaux

Louisiana native Kent Desormeaux continues to add to a career that in 2004 earned him induction into the Racing Hall of Fame. Desormeaux has earned three Eclipse Awards, the first coming for 1987 when he was named outstanding apprentice jockey. He received the Eclipse as outstanding journeyman jockey in 1989 and 1992, joining Steve Cauthen and Chris McCarron as Eclipse winners in both the apprentice and over-

all jockey categories. (Julien Leparoux joined the elite group when he received the 2009 Eclipse as outstanding jockey.)

Desormeaux has won the Kentucky Derby (G1) with Real Quiet, Fusaichi Pegasus and Big Brown. He won the Preakness Stakes (G1) on Real Quiet and won the 2009 Belmont Stakes (G1) on eventual champion Summer Bird. He has victories in the Breeders' Cup World Championships aboard eventual Horse of the Year Koltashan (FR), as well as Desert Stormer and Corinthian. Desormeaux has been a leading jockey in Japan.

In his career, Desormeaux has won more than 5,400 races and has ridden the earners of nearly \$255 million around the world. At Keeneland, he has 100 victories, including 17 stakes wins, prior to 2010. He was the leading jockey during Keeneland's 2008 spring meeting with 22 wins.

Desormeaux' first Keeneland stakes victory came in 1996 when he rode Afternoon Deelites to win the Commonwealth Breeders' Cup (G2). Desormeaux has won Grade 1 races at Keeneland aboard Keeper Hill in the

1999 Three Chimneys Spinster; on Ticker Tape (GB) in the 2004 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup; on Carriage Trail in the 2008 Juddmonte Spinster; on Mr. Sidney in the 2009 Maker's Mark Mile (G1) and on Mushka in the 2009 Juddmonte Spinster. His five stakes wins at the track last year included the Bourbon (G3) on Interactif, one of his scheduled rivals in the Toyota Blue Grass, and the Fort Harrod on Gangbuster, who is trained by his brother, Keith.

Desormeaux scored his 18th career stakes win at Keeneland stakes on April 3 when he rode Evening Jewel to win the Central Bank Ashland (G1).

Racing fans are probably quite familiar with the red-and-white silks of Ken and Sarah Ramsey, who received the 2004 Eclipse Award as outstanding owners. At Keeneland, the Ramseys have been the leading owners in the spring – 2004 (tie) and 2006 – and in the fall – 2000 (tie), 2002 (tie), 2007 (tie), 2008 and 2009. They also have been the leading owner at every other track in Kentucky, including a record 16 titles at Churchill Downs, and have topped the standings at Gulfstream Park in Florida and Saratoga in New York. They were North America's leading owners by earnings in 2005.

The Ramseys participate in every level of the sport, racing claiming-level runners to horses competing in the most prestigious events in the United States and internationally. Outstanding horses they have owned include Roses in May, who won the 2005 Dubai World Cup; turf champion Kitten's Joy; and 2009 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) winner Furthest Land. Ken Ramsey is an avid handicapper who claimed Furthest Land for \$35,000.

At Keeneland, the Ramseys have won three stakes, including the 2004 Shadwell Turf Mile (G1) with Nothing to Lose and the 2005 Lane's End Breeders' Futurity (G1) with Dawn of War. Ramsey runners this year include homebred Lane's End Stakes (G2) winner Dean's Kitten, by Kitten's Joy.

The Ramseys stand Kitten's Joy at their 1,400-acre Ramsey Farm near Nicholasville, Kentucky. They purchased the farm, the former Almahurst Farm, in 1994. Exterminator, the 1918 Kentucky Derby winner, and Standardbred legend Greyhound were foaled on the property. The Ramseys also own the stallion Catienus, who currently stands in New York.

Trainer: Wesley Ward

After a successful career as a jockey during which he won the 1984 Eclipse Award as outstanding apprentice, Wesley Ward has turned his talents to training horses. As of April 4, he had won 849 races and trained the earners of \$20.8 million. His stakes winners include Men's Exclusive and Unfinished Symph, who both captured multiple added-money races in California during their careers.

Ward also is particularly successful with 2-year-olds. In 2007, he sent out One Hot Wish to set a 4 1/2-furlong world record of :48.87 at Keeneland. A year ago, he sent out first-time starter Jealous Again to a maiden victory at the track. The filly returned to run second in the Kentucky Juvenile Stakes (G3) at Churchill Downs, and she traveled to England to win the Queen Mary Stakes (Eng-G1) during the prestigious Royal Ascot meeting.

On opening day of Keeneland's 2010 spring season, Ward finished second in the Transylvania (G3) with Strike the Tiger. Last year, that gelding also won at Royal Ascot, taking the Windsor Castle Stakes the day before Jealous Again's victory. Strike the Tiger followed that performance by winning the Chenery Stakes at Colonial Downs in Virginia.

Born in Washington, Ward is the son of trainer Dennis Ward. The younger Ward rode until 1989, retiring because of weight problems. He assisted his father before going out on his own and saddled his first runner in 1991. Ward is known for mentoring young riders, including Christian Santiago Reyes, who won the Eclipse as outstanding apprentice of 2009.

Jockey: Julien Leparoux

Keeneland has been an important chapter in the career of Julien Leparoux. In 2006, Leparoux was the leading rider at the track in the spring (in a tie with Rafael Bejarano) and in the fall. He was Keeneland's leading rider again in the spring of 2007 and 2009.

Leparoux is coming off a year in which he achieved a unique double. He received the Eclipse Award as outstanding jockey in 2009, adding that honor

to his 2006 Eclipse Award as outstanding apprentice jockey. He joined Steve Cauthen, Chris McCarron and Kent Desormeaux as the others to win an Eclipse as an apprentice and as a journeyman.

Helping Leparoux to the 2009 Eclipse were three wins during the Breeders' Cup World Championships, including riding eventual champion She Be Wild to win the Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) and eventual champion Informed Decision to capture the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1). He rode both horses at Keeneland, where he won a total of six stakes during the spring and fall racing seasons.

Born in France, Leparoux knew as a youngster that he wanted to be a jockey. His late father, Robert, had been a jockey and then an assistant trainer.

Leparoux came to the United States in early 2003 to become an exercise rider for fellow countryman Patrick Biancone. He began his riding career at Saratoga in the summer of 2005 and won his first race on August 18 with only his third mount. Since then, Leparoux has earned other leading riding titles at Churchill Downs and at Turfway Park.

At Keeneland, Leparoux has won 163 races, including 18 stakes, through April 3, including the Transylvania (G3) on opening day of this year's spring season. In 2006, Leparoux won six stakes at the track, including the Juddmonte Spinster (G1) on Asi Siempre. In 2008, he won the First Lady (G1) at Keeneland on eventual champion Forever Together, and the two captured the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1) in their next start.

As of April 4, Leparoux had 1,189 wins and ridden the earners of more than \$58 million. His stakes wins this year include the Carter Handicap (G1) on Warrior's Reward and the Gotham Stakes (G3) on Awesome Act.
