Walt Robertson, Vice President of Sales

Walt Robertson, a long-time leader in the equine auction industry, was named to the newly created position of Vice President of Sales in January 2011.

Robertson joined Keeneland following 35 years at Fasig-Tipton, and will oversee and direct all functions of the Keeneland sales.

In addition to his vast work in the Thoroughbred industry, Robertson also has been active in the central Kentucky community for many years. He has served as Chairman of the Kentucky Horse Park Commission, is a former director and past President of the Thoroughbred Club of America and is a past member of the Sayre School and The Lexington School boards of trustees. He also continues to serve as President/Auctioneer for Swinebroad-Denton, Inc., a full-service real estate auction company in Lexington.



Geoffrey G. Russell, Director of Sales

Geoffrey Russell joined Keeneland prior to the 1996 September Yearling Sale as Assistant Director of Sales to Rogers Beasley. He has served as Director of Sales since June 2001.

Born in Dublin, Ireland, Russell worked at Coolmore Stud and as a bid spotter at Goffs. He came to the United States in 1982 and worked at Fasig-Tipton Sales before leaving to work at Elmendorf Farm. He returned to Fasig-Tipton as Vice President of Fasig-Tipton Appraisals and Director of Sales Administration prior to joining the Keeneland staff.

Russell represents Keeneland on the Sales Integrity Task Force, and the Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers



(SITA), having served as the organization's chairman in 2003 and 2004. He also sits on the board of the Grayson-Jockey Club Foundation.

Thomas J. Thornbury, Associate Director of Sales

Tom Thornbury joined Keeneland as Associate Director of Sales in June 2002.

Thornbury grew up on the farm owned by his father, John Thornbury, and his partner, Dr. Robert Copelan, where he was involved in training and farm management, and assisted in equine orthopedic surgery. Thornbury spent nearly 10 years at Airdrie Stud, owned by former Governor and Mrs. Brereton C. Jones, working first as yearling manager and later as general manager.

He is a past-president of the Thoroughbred Club of America and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers Club, and formerly served on the board of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners & Breeders.

Thornbury's primary duties at Keeneland involve acting as liaison to consignor interests, developing relationships with horsemen in emerging racing markets, and serving as a member of the inspection team.



Ryan Mahan, Senior Auctioneer

Keeneland's senior auctioneer, Ryan Mahan, considered following his stepfather, Dr. Robert Copelan, into veterinary medicine. Instead, he finds himself in the auction stand at the leading Thoroughbred sales in the world.

Mahan initially had his own auction company but in 1977 he came to work at Keeneland as a bid spotter and later chief announcer for several years following the departure of Tom Hammond. Promoted to auctioneer in the mid '80s, he succeeded the late Tom Caldwell in 2001 as senior



auctioneer. Mahan also serves on the inspection committee for Keeneland's September Yearling Sale.

Chauncey Morris, Sales Marketing Associate

Chauncey Morris has been traveling the world to promote Keeneland and Thoroughbred racing for nearly a decade.

In November 2002, Keeneland tapped Morris to establish an emerging markets program within the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners & Breeders Inc. which sought to develop relations with countries whose growing Thoroughbred breeding and racing programs had been positively affected by globalization.

Morris joined the Keeneland sales staff in March 2006, where he continues to oversee a global sales strategy as well as initiatives to attract a new generation of owners in the United States.

Morris formerly served as a trade specialist for the Kentucky Department of Agriculture from 1999–2001, when he was appointed as an analyst and advisor to then-Governor Paul Patton's Office of Agricultural Policy.



Mark Maronde, Sales Account Executive

Mark Maronde brings more than 20 years of experience in the Thoroughbred industry to the Keeneland sales team, which he joined in April 2009.

As account executive, he assists with recruiting and marketing efforts for the Keeneland sales.

(1996 – 2009) and with the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society (2007- 2009). He also worked for Cromwell Bloodstock from 1990 – 1995.

19th Annual

Keeneland has cataloged 169 horses for the 2011 April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, scheduled for Monday, April 11. The one-day session begins at 4 p.m. ET.

Prospective buyers will have the opportunity to see the juveniles perform under tack during the one-day Preview Show, to be held Thursday, April 7, beginning at 10:30 a.m. on Keeneland's main track.

Prominent stallions represented by 2011 April Sale juveniles include A.P. Indy, Afleet Alex, Bernardini, Congrats, Empire Maker, Dynaformer, Giant's Causeway, Indian Charlie, Malibu Moon, Medaglia d'Oro, Mr. Greeley, Pulpit, Smart Strike, Speightstown, Storm Cat, Street Cry (IRE), Tapit, Tiznow, Unbridled's Song, among others.

Also cataloged are two-year-olds by promising freshman sires such as Any Given Saturday, Corinthian, Flashy Bull, Half Ours, Hard Spun, Lawyer Ron, Political Force, Scat Daddy, Stevie Wonderboy, and Street Sense.

The April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale was inaugurated in 1993 to meet the growing demand of owners who wish to purchase a 'ready-made' racehorse.

Since that time, the April Sale has produced five classic winners – **Lookin At Lucky, Big Brown, Thunder Gulch,**

Keeper Hill and Gal in a Ruckus.

Lookin At Lucky, winner of the 2010 Preakness Stakes (G1) and more than \$3.3 million in earnings, is one of only five colts to be named champion at both two and three. Purchased by co-owner Mike Pegram for \$475,000 from Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent, at the 2009 April Sale, the Smart Strike colt won five graded stakes before winning the Preakness (G1) and Haskell Invitational (G1).

Big Brown, 2008 champion three-year-old colt and winner of the Kentucky Derby (G1) and Preakness, sold for \$190,000 to Hidden Brook, agent for Paul Pompa Jr., at the 2007 April Sale. Consigned by Eddie Woods, agent, Big Brown earned more than \$3.6 million during his career.

Other notable April Sale graduates include 2010 Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1) winner **Haynesfield**; Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile (G1) winner **Jersey Town** and Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) winner **My Jen**.

Hughes has been active in the real estate investment field for more than 30 years. In 1972, he founded Public Storage Inc. with a \$50,000 investment, and oversaw the growth of the company into the world's largest owner and operator of self-storage facilities with over 1 million customers. Today, Public Storage manages more than 2,100 self-storage facilities in 38 states and seven European countries. Additionally, through its affiliate, PS Business Parks, the company has an interest in approximately 19 million net rentable square feet of commercial and industrial space in eight states. Hughes is Chairman of the Board of Public Storage, having retired as Chief Executive Officer in 2002.

Among the horses Hughes has campaigned is Eclipse Award champion and 2003 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) winner Action This Day, who he bought for \$150,000 at the 2002 July Selected Yearling Sale; Grade 1 turf specialist Joyeux Danseur, purchased for \$450,000 at the 1994 July Sale, and Group 1 winner Shake the Yoke. Background: Bob Baffert grew up on his family's cattle ranch in Nogales, Arizona. At age 10, he started grooming and galloping Quarter Horses for his father before having a brief career as a jockey in 1970. He recorded his first win as a trainer in 1971. After graduating from the University of Arizona's Race Track Industry Program with a degree in racetrack management and animal sciences, Baffert began training Thoroughbreds and posted his first win in 1979.

Baffert has enjoyed great success with owners Mike Pegram and Hal Earnhardt in particular. In addition to two-time Eclipse champion and Preakness (G1) winner Lookin At Lucky, Baffert has trained such champions as Silverbulletday and Midnight Lute, and 1998 Kentucky Derby (G1) and

Preakness winner Real Quiet, for Pegram.

Baffert has won the first two legs of the Triple Crown on three occasions, taking the Kentucky Derby and Preakness with Silver Charm (1997), Real Quiet (1998), and War Emblem (2002). In 2010 he won the Preakness with Lookin At Lucky, and in 2001, he saddled Point Given to win the Preakness, Belmont (G1) and Horse of the Year honors.

Since 1988, Baffert has been involved with Thoroughbred sales as well, beginning at Keeneland. Baffert's first Thoroughbred purchase at auction was Thirty Slews, who he bought for \$30,000 at the September Yearling Sale that went on to win the 1992 Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1). In 1997, Baffert purchased the July Selected Yearling Sale topper, Forestry, for \$1.5 million – the first time he made such a high purchase. Two years later, Forestry became a Grade 1 winner.

Background: Donald Little Jr. wanted to

make participating in horse racing a businessman's risk instead of a speculation, so he created Centennial Farms in 1982.

Centennial focuses on purchasing high-quality racing prospects that can be developed into successful racehorses and ultimately highly desirable stallions. Through partnerships, shareholders own a group of colts. All purchases are set up as stallion syndicates from the beginning. At the end of the partnership, shareholders can elect to sell their interest at syndication or retain them for breeding purposes. Although the primary focus for Centennial is acquiring colts, they also assist clients with broodmare acquisition, filly purchases for racing and breeding, and stallion management.

Dr. Stephen Carr and Paula Parsons have been members of the Centennial team since 1983. Carr, head of bloodstock acquisition, is a lifelong track veterinarian who has treated and cared for such top Thoroughbreds as Forego and Secretariat. Parsons is head trainer at the farm in Middleburg, Virginia, but is mainly responsible for the early development of all of the farm's horses. Parsons was the initial trainer for Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Go for Gin.

Centennial horses have won or placed in over 60 graded stakes and earned more than \$10 million. The racing partnership campaigned 1992 Eclipse Award sprint champion Rubiano and 1993 Belmont Stakes (G1) winner Colonial Affair. Other prominent stakes winners include Lil's Lad, Corinthian, Chelokee, King Cugat, Signal Tap, Alyten, and Silent Account.

Mrs. Cornwallis became Dogwood's first stakes winner in 1971 and allowed the operation to prosper in its early days. Soon, Dogwood had 18 horses and 45 investors. In 1987, the Campbells moved Dogwood from their Greenville, Georgia, training farm to its current headquarters in Aiken, S.C.

Campbell, an originator of the Thoroughbred racing partnership, continues to pursue moderately priced, young horses offering bloodlines with the best potential for performance for his syndicates.

Dogwood Stables has campaigned such stakes winners as 1990 Preakness (G1) winner and sire Summer Squall, 1996 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) winner and champion Storm Song, and champion steeplechaser Inlander. Among the other prominent horses to wear the green and yellow silks are Cotton Blossom, Dominion, Limehouse, Nassipour, Smok'n Frolic, Southjet, Trippi, and Wallenda.
